Editorial

To address the issues and challenges of modern librarianship, a National Conference on Modern Librarianship: Opportunities and Challenges is jointly organized by the Resource Centre, National Institute of Fashion Technology, Mumbai and Bombay Science Librarians' Association, Mumbai during June 8-9, 2018.

He explained how new technologies are emerging especially Google Generation creating hurdles and imposing challenges to the LIS professionals. He further focused on the impact of social media platforms on the delivery of services to the users. Dr. Brijesh Deore, Joint Director, NIFT, Mumbai presided over the function. Best Librarian Award

Dr. R. Prabakaran, Head, SIRC, TIFR, Mumbai and General Secretary, BOSLA, announced the

BOSLA – Koganurmath Best Librarian Award of the year 2017. The award was received by Dr. Vinita Jain, Librarian, Maharshi Dayanand College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Parel, Mumbai. Prof. C.R. Karisiddappa in his Key note address emphasized on the innovations that transformed the libraries especially from Guternberg's Printing Machine to Mark Zuckerbeg's Facebook.



He further explained that library services are inadequate due to the growing demands of users who operate in the networked and virtual environment. He also touched upon the different phases of library management like modernization and transformation. summarized the keynote address with the given by Richard statement "Transformed people Transform people". There were five Invited Talks by the eminent scholars in LIS profession. Mr. Sven Carlson, Founder and CEO of leading Automated Materials Handling, Bibliotheca presented his views on "Trending Tools and Techniques". Prof. B. Ramesha, Professor, Department of Bangalore University, Bengaluru LIS, presented on "SMAC – Social Mobile Analytics Cloud for Libraries"



He presented statistics on Internet, Social media and mobile users of the World in general and country specific stats in particular and summarized SMAC is the convergence to enhance user experience.



Prof. B. Ramesh Babu, former Professor, Department of Information Science, Madras University, Chennai presented on "Is Modern Librarianship as a Profession in India is at Cross Roads? Issues, Challenges and Suggestions!". Dr. Ranjit Kumar Das, IIT, Mumbai presented on "Human Resource Management" at libraries. He focused on the importance of Human Resource Management in the Library and Information Centres.



Prof. B.D. Kumbar, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Karnatak University, Dharwad presented "Public Library System and Acts in India". He touched upon the implementation of Library Legislation in India scenario. He identified that Finance is the crucial problem for all the states and union territories in India and south Indian states in particular.

The national conference was organized in eight Technical Sessions with various themes. The Technical Session 1 'Digital Libraries' was chaired by Prof. B. Ramesh Babu, former Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Madras University, Chennai and Co-Chaired by Dr. J. Shivaram, TISS, Mumbai. Out of 9 papers in the technical sessions, 6 papers were presented by the delegates. Most of the presented papers highlighted on institutional repositories and open access tools.



The Technical Session – 2 Library Technologies and Trends" was Chaired by Dr. R. Prabhakaran, Head, Scientific Information Resource Centre, TIFR, Mumbai and Co-Chaired by Dr. Ishappa Bandi, Deputy Librarian, BITS Pilani, Jaipur. Out of 13 papers there were 8 papers presented in the technical session. Cloud computing, RFID and social media platforms were some of the areas covered in the technical session.



The Technical Session - 3 on "Library Resource Sharing and Consortia" was Chaired by Dr.

Mallikarjun Vaddankeri, Librarian, PDA Engineering College, Kalaburgi and Co-Chaired by Dr. P.S. Kattimani, Librarian, Central University of Karnataka, Kalaburgi. Four papers were presented in this session.

The Technical Session 4 on "Scientometrics, Webometrics and Altmetrics" was chaired by Dr Praveen Kumar and Co-chaired by Dr Mavin. Out of 13 papers, 8 papers were presented by the authors in this technical session. Scientometrics analysis on different disciplines was the major issues presented by the presenters.



Technical Session — 5: "Human Resource Management" was chaired by Dr Brijesh Devre Joint Director, National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT), Mumbai and Co-chaired by Dr Agadi Assistant Librarian, Central University Library, Gandhinagar Out of 13 papers there were 8 papers presented in the session. Marketing of Library products and Knowledge Management were some the issues emphasized by the presenters.

Out of 13 papers there 8 papers presented. The presenters focused on public library system, Intellectual Property Rights, Plagiarism.

Technical Session — 8: "Harnessing Web Resources" was chaired by Ms. Savita Rao Chief Librarian at Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (CDAC) and co-chaired by Mr. Ganesh Yadav Assistant, Resource Centre, National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT), Mumbai. Out of 05 papers there were 03 papers presented. Search engines, Federated search were the topics covered in the session.
